PSMLA 2013 Conference in Pittsburgh: A Major Success!

October 17-19, 2013, the PSMLA Fall Conference was held at the DoubleTree in Greentree (Pittsburgh) and attended by nearly 200 PSMLA members, exhibitors, and presenters from the state of Pennsylvania as well as from many other states.

The pre-conference workshop, Digital Storytelling Apps N'at (N'at is not a typo but represents yet another language: Pittsburghese) was well-attended and conducted by Silvina Orsatti, from the University of Pittsburgh at Greensburg.

Silvina shared many sites, apps, and strategies to use technology to enhance student involvement and engagement in storytelling.

On Friday and Saturday, October 18-19, there were 30 different sessions from which members could choose. These sessions included a variety of languages, strategies, presenters, and opportunities for infusing fresh perspectives

into teaching and learning.

Dr. Bonnie Adair-Hauck, in her keynote speech Assessment in Foreign Language Learning: Curse or Cure, shared with attendees her research, experiences, and resul-

tant challenges to the world language profession.

A highlight at the end of Friday afternoon was a wine and cheese reception for attendees, presenters, and exhibitors to visit, collabo-

rate, and relax. Special appearances were made by Pittsburgh Pirate mascot the Pirate Parrot and Steeler mascot Steely McBeam. Lots of fun and photo ops ensued.

More about the 2013 Conference Awardees


Bonnie Adair-Hauck, Ph.D. is a second language research professor for the *University of Pittsburgh's European Studies Center and the European Union Center of Excellence* where she also serves as a language consultant for educational institutions both nationally and internationally. Since 2001, she has served as the Director of the *University of Pittsburgh's French Immersion Institutes* designed to broaden middle and high school teachers' cultural understanding of French speaking countries while concurrently strengthening their French speaking/listening skills. Bonnie is also a Past-President of PSMLA and has long been involved with PSMLA in a variety of ways.

Dr. Frank B. Brooks, Associate Professor of Spanish and Foreign Language Education, who has been teaching for over three decades, is currently on the faculty at IUP. At IUP, Dr. Brooks teaches Spanish language and conversation, works with students pursuing their teaching certificate in Spanish Education, and currently serves as co-chair of the <u>IUP Spring Methodology Conference on the Teaching of Foreign Languages</u>.

Margaret Carlson is a Spanish and French teacher for the Deer Lakes School District and served as department chair for ten years. She has also taught a master level class at the University of Pittsburgh and methodology at La Roche College. Fall PSMLA Executive Council Meeting Highlights

The fall meeting for the PSMLA Executive Council (ExCo) was at the Penn Stater, September 28-29, 2013.

PSMLA President Thomasina White developed the agenda, committees met and gave reports, and plans were made for future workshops and conferences.

Treasurer's Report (D. Wills)

Council examined the treasurer's report Several council members conducted an internal audit of the finances following lunch on Saturday. Debbie reported that money continues to come in from conference registrations and from the conference exhibitors.

Secretary's Report (P. Rzodkiewicz)
Phyllis reported that we currently have
468 members and 23 Institutional members. The number of members has increased considerably since the spring due to the number of teachers and students who have become members because they will attend the conference in October
2013.

Advertising Manager's Report (R. Hall)
Bob Hall and Junko Yamamoto are working together as Ad and Exhibit Managers.
Junko will replace Bob as Ad and Exhibits manager in January. They reported that currently there are 15 tables for the conference. They also reported on the number of ads for the Forum and for the PSMLA 2013 conference brochure.

<u>Website Manager's Report</u> (R. DelPorto) Ron reported that there has been more activity lately on the website because the elections were held through Election Buddy.

Advocacy (M. Levenson)

Memos, alerts, and information regarding funding and legislative efforts in Washington have been sent regularly to members. Sister Mary Helen Kashuba represented both PSMLA and AATF at the JNCL-NCLIS meeting in May.
