- Provide universities with documentation to award college credit to students
- Prepare students with 21st century skills

- Recognize the different cultures within the community

## Requirements

To receive the Seal of Biliteracy, students must...

- demonstrate a minimum of intermediate-high proficiency in a world language
- 2. demonstrate intermediate-high proficiency in English

## Testing Criteria

 A minimum score of intermediate-high on the OPI and WPT

4 or 5 on the Advanced Placement (AP)
 World Language and Culture Exam

or

 A minimum score of I-5 on the ACTFL AAPPL

or

 A minimum score of 6 on the Avant STAMP4S
