When we are in the physical classroom, it is easy to float around the room to monitor and enjoy students' use of the target language. How can we transfer this simple practice to an online platform? How can we engage students in interpersonal speaking and encourage them to remain in the target language even when the teacher is not within earshot? No method is foolproof, but there are some simple tools available via Zoom, Schoology, PearDeck, and Google that can help teachers help students stay in the target language.

Outside her regular classroom duties, Megan serves on the PSMLA Executive Council and is co-founder and co-director of the Association of World Language Educators, a regional organization that provides professional development for world language teachers. In her home school district, she serves on a committee for the district's dual language immersion program.
