Spring PSMLA Executive Council Meeting Highlights

The spring meeting for the PSMLA Executive Council (ExCo) was at the Penn Stater, April 13-14, 2013.

PSMLA President Thomasina White developed the agenda, committees met and gave reports, and plans were made for future workshops and conferences.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (P. Rzodkiewicz for D. Wills)

Council examined the Treasurer's report. Council learned that the external audit was completed and no irregularities were found.

Secretary's Report (P. Rzodkiewicz)
Phyllis reported that we currently have 388 members and 20 Institutional members.
This is a low number for membership.
Council discussed steps to take to increase and maintain membership.

Advertising Manager's Report (R. Hall) Bob reported on the plans for the exhibit at the fall conference and discussed lowering the prices for ads in the Forum. He also announced that he has decided to resign as Ad Manager after this year's fall conference. The board congratulated and thanked him for his service since 2003.

<u>Website Manager's Report</u> (R. DelPorto) Ron will again set up Election Buddy to run the PSMLA elections for the fall.

Advocacy (M. Levenson)

Requests have been made for letter writing to congressmen and senators in support of Foreign Language funding and initiatives.

Finance (J. Stewart)

Council discussed the importance of maintaining membership. Not all teachers are able to attend workshops or the annual conference with districts cutting back. Council will examine the breakdown of the expenses by ExCo.

ACT 48 (S. Nimmrichter)

Susanne reported that we do need to recertify this year to be able to award ACT 48 hours.

CCA (P. Rzodkiewicz for D. Wills)

The product for this year's competition was ONE a Day Teen Advantage for Him/Her. The country was Chile. The competition was held on April 30 at the University of Pittsburgh. A video workshop was held in February joined by approximately eight schools online.

JNCL (M. Levenson)

Council discussed the importance of our continued involvement with JNCL. Sister Mary Helen Kashuba will attend the JNCL Lobby Day this year in Mina's place. She will be there to represent both AATF and PSMLA.

NECTFL – (N. Puhala)

NECTL was held in March at the Baltimore Marriott Waterfront. To help the organization, NECTFL membership is now available for \$50 and includes: reduced registration fees, three free webinars, and access to a members-only section online.

PAC-TE (S. Nimmrichter)

PAC-TE started an initiative to work with PDE and the state legislature to respond quickly, proactively, and uniformly with recommendations and suggestions when changes to the School Code and/or state regulations, either for PK-12 education or teacher/school leader preparation are under consideration. PAC-TE developed a Talking Points Document that many of the associations, including PSMLA, endorsed. The document was released to the press in April.

ACTFL and Conference 2012 (T. White) ACTFL thanked PSMLA for making the conference such a great success. The participation and support of PSMLA

contributed greatly to the success of the fall conference.
