PSMLA Global Scholars Program - 2017 Updates

The PSMLA Global Scholars Program is an initiative that recognizes students who make choices that help them develop global awareness, which will better prepare them for personal and professional success in an increasingly global society. This program was recently highlighted by ACTFL and their *Lead with Languages* campaign as a success story at the state level. *Lead with Languages* is a national campaign aimed at making language proficiency a national priority.

There are currently sixteen schools across the state enrolled in the Global Scholars program. It is in its third year of implementation and, though it is designed as a 4-year program, 3 Pennsylvania students completed all 4 years of requirements in the first year and 37 Pennsylvania students from 8 different schools graduated as PSMLA Global Scholars in the 2nd year of the program. These students, their Global Scholars advisors, and the schools are to be congratulated for their accomplishments. The schools are: Antietam High School, Avonworth High School, Camp Hill Senior High School, Chartiers Valley High School, Fox Chapel Area High School, Hempfield Area High School, Kennard-Dale High School, and Penncrest High School.
